I YOUR COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS:

Safety Issues – Planning and Transportation Matters 1. (6) That all Civic Departments **BE REQUESTED** to include the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) in all consultations related to crime prevention and safety matters, prior to the finalization of a project; it being noted that the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee heard a verbal presentation and received a communication dated November 9, 2009 from B. Brock with respect to safety issues with respect to planning and transportation matters.

II YOUR COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Update on Police Activities 2. (2) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) heard a verbal presentation and received the attached statistics from R. Black, London Police Services, with respect to the Police Statistics for the month of October, 2009.

Update on Fire Activities 3. (3) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) heard a verbal presentation and received the attached statistics from J. Wever, London Fire Services, with respect to the Fire Statistics for the month of October, 2009.

Vacant Buildings By-law 4. (5) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee received a Municipal Council resolution adopted at its meeting held on November 9, 2009 with respect to the proposed Vacant Buildings By-law. The CSCP asked the Manager of By-law Enforcement to advise the CSCP of the implications of a tax-exempt building falling into disrepair; it being noted that properties that are deemed unsafe and require demolition will have the costs added to the tax roll of the property.

Canada Safety Council 5. (7) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee postponed consideration of the communication dated October 27, 2009 from J. Smith, President, Canada Safety Council, with respect to the Canada Safety Council membership renewal request, to its next meeting.

Traffic Light Signal Timing 6. That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee heard a verbal presentation from S. Maguire, Division Manager, Parking and Traffic Signals, with respect to traffic light signal timing.

Trauma Program Statistics 7. (Add) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) asked J. Tomlinson to ascertain the status of the CSCP request for motor vehicle collision information for the past 3 to 5 years from the London Health Sciences Centre Trauma Program, relating to the number of collisions between motor vehicles and pedestrians as well as the ages of the pedestrians involved; it being noted this information was requested.

Leading Causes of Unintentional Injury: A Statistical Profile of Middlesex-London 8. (Add) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) received the revised "Leading Causes of Unintentional Injury: A Statistical Profile of Middlesex-London" from the Middlesex London Health Unit. The CSCP postponed consideration of the Statistical Profile to its February meeting when an entomologist from the Middlesex-London Health Unit will be present to provide the CSCP with an overview of the Statistical Profile.

Pedestrian Safety

9. (Add) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) asked the Division Manager of Transportation Planning and Design provide information at a future CSCP meeting related to the status of the warrants and standards for pedestrians that are being considered in the creation of Book 15 of the Ontario Traffic Manual; it being noted that the CSCP would like to provide input into the safety aspects of the material in the manual prior to the finalization of the manual; it being also noted that the Environment and Transportation Committee (ETC) has asked the Division Manager of Transportation Planning and Design to report back to the ETC on this matter.

Skateboarding Parks

10. (Add) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) asked the Director of Parks and Recreation to attend a future CSCP meeting to provide information related to proposed skateboard parks, the criteria used to determine the locations these and how safety and crime prevention are implemented in their design.

Downtown Master Plan

11. (Add) That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) asked the Senior Planner to attend a future meeting of the CSCP to provide information related to the crime prevention and safety aspects in the Downtown Master Plan.

12. That the Community Safety and Crime Prevention Advisory Committee (CSCP) received and noted the following:
